Welcome to IX NALAS General Assembly

10-11 April 2014, Sarajevo, Bosnia and Herzegovina

Sarajevo is capital and the largest city of Bosnia and Herzegovina. It is its administrative, economic, cultural, educational and sports center. The city is famous for its traditional cultural and religious diversity. Although settlement in the area stretches back to prehistoric times, the modern city arose as an Ottoman stronghold in the 15th century.

Sarajevo has attracted international attention several times throughout its history. In 1885, Sarajevo was the first city in Europe and the second city in the world to have a full-time electric tram network running through the city, following San Francisco. In 1914, it was the site of the assassination of the Archduke of Austria that sparked World War I. Seventy years later, it hosted the 1984 Winter Olympics.

Today, Sarajevo is the fastest growing city on Bosnia and Herzegovina. The city of Sarajevo is a unit of local self-governance, which consists of four city municipalities: Old City, Center, New City and New Sarajevo.
