- -require direct involvment and commitment of **different** local actors.





- Improve realization of social and human rights



OUTREACH WORKER

The main benefits from these services at individual level

- improved social, health, educational, employment and in general life situations.
- strengthened self-esteem, created positive picture and empowered persons left behind.
- increased access to the range of supports and opportunities
- supported in solving life situations, difficulties, problems and challenges.
- strengthened educational competences and learning skills.
- Improved parental skills.



The main benefits at local level:

- 1. Meet the **real needs and priorities of communities** by:
- ✓ Implementation of needs assessments and social mapping;
- √ Creating social protection programs and plans;
- ✓ Creating planned and sustained rather than ad-hoc budgets, which are strictly earmarked for specific programs and services needed at the local level.
- 2. Build positive relationships with people in need of care and assistance
- ✓ Communities see vulnerable groups as resources, not problems.
- 3. Creating an inclusive and accessible society/municipality for all.
- 4. Implement Agenda 2030
