

## **Sofia Declaration**

on
Enforcing the political neutrality and independence
of Local Government Associations

by the Presidents of NALAS Member Associations

Sofia, 15 June 2010

Considering the principles of the local self-government enshrined in the European Charter of the Local Self-Government, ratified by almost all NALAS member countries,

Convinced that EU integration cannot be achieved without a strong, modern and effective local self governments, <sup>1</sup>

Recognizing the democratic right and the autonomy of local governments to associate for their common cause,

*Convinced* that decentralization cannot be successful without strong local government associations, which are the natural and often the main drivers of the decentralization process,

*In respect* to the status of the local government associations as non-political organizations, consolidating all local authorities irrespective of their political views, ethnic structure, size, economic development, etc.,

*Noting* some worrying fragmentation trends in some NALAS member associations,

#### We, Presidents of NALAS Local Government Associations:

### Encourage local elected officials and local governments to:

- Be active and support their national association and claim for a fair representation of their interests or convictions.
- *Push* for consolidation and co-ordination of activities in countries where associations are fragmented, based on political or ethnical divide, or even when division is based on historical developments or /and on legally induced distinction between different types and levels of local government units,

# Invite Central Governments of South East European countries to:

- Assure a legal framework which will encourage cooperation of all local authorities under a single national umbrella,
- Assure a higher fiscal autonomy of the local governments and,
- *Increase* the predictability of local funding in a multi-year perspective,
- Avoid any form of favoritism in distribution of grants or other decisions and policies which might provoke fragmentation of existing national association of local governments
- Be aware that a strong and unified association can be a significant partner in implementing government policies and advancing quality of services to citizens,
- *Use* the national associations to build partnerships with local authorities which is vital for EU integration processes and use of EU funds;

#### *Urge parties and party leaders to:*

• *Refrain* from any interference in the internal affairs of the local government associations for the sake of their own political and electoral interests,

## Appeal donors and international partners to:

- Raise and diversify the forms of support for the development of strong national associations of local governments from South-East Europe,
- Be cautious if any activity might encourage fragmentation of a national association,

### We, the Presidents, commit that our Local Government Associations will:

- Refrain from any form of political affiliation and remain politically neutral,
- *Rely* on the principles of impartiality and equidistance, placing the protection of their members' rights and interests above any differences of political or ethnical nature,
- *Ensure* equal representation of its members in the association's governing bodies regardless their political views, religious belief or ethnical origins, and will avoid any form of discrimination based on these criteria,
- *Address* the interests of different groups of local government units (such as urban versus rural, small versus big, ethnical background),

## and, where applicable:

- Search the dialogue with other associations, their affiliated local governments and non affiliated local governments in the country in search for unification
- Search the dialogue with central government to create the necessary legal framework for unified associations
- *Support*, under the umbrella of NALAS, those unification processes in countries where needed,

Our target is that – by the end of 2012 – all NALAS member countries have strong local government associations and/or consensual organizations or at least a functioning coordination mechanism for advocacy among the existing associations that represent and defend common interests of all local authorities in their country.
