"We are determined to take the bold and transformative steps, which are urgently needed to shift the world on to a sustainable and resilient path. As we embark on this collective journey, we pledge that **no one will be left behind.**"

"As we embark on this collective journey, we pledge that no one will be left behind. Recognizing that the dignity of the human person is fundamental we wish to see the Goals and targets met for all nations and peoples and for all segments of society. And we will endeavour to reach the **furthest behind first.**"

"Quality, accessible, timely and reliable disaggregated data will be needed to help with the measurement of progress and to ensure that **no one is left behind.** Such data is key to decision-making."

"To promote physical and mental health and well being and to extend life expectancy for all, we must achieve universal health coverage and access to quality health care. **No one must be left behind.**"

"Follow-up and review processes at all levels will be guided by the following principles. (...) They will be people-centred, gender-sensitive, respect human rights and have a particular focus on the poorest, most vulnerable and **those furthest behind.**"

"We commit to engaging in systematic follow-up and review of the implementation of this Agenda over the next 15 years (...) in order to ensure that **no one is left behind.**"

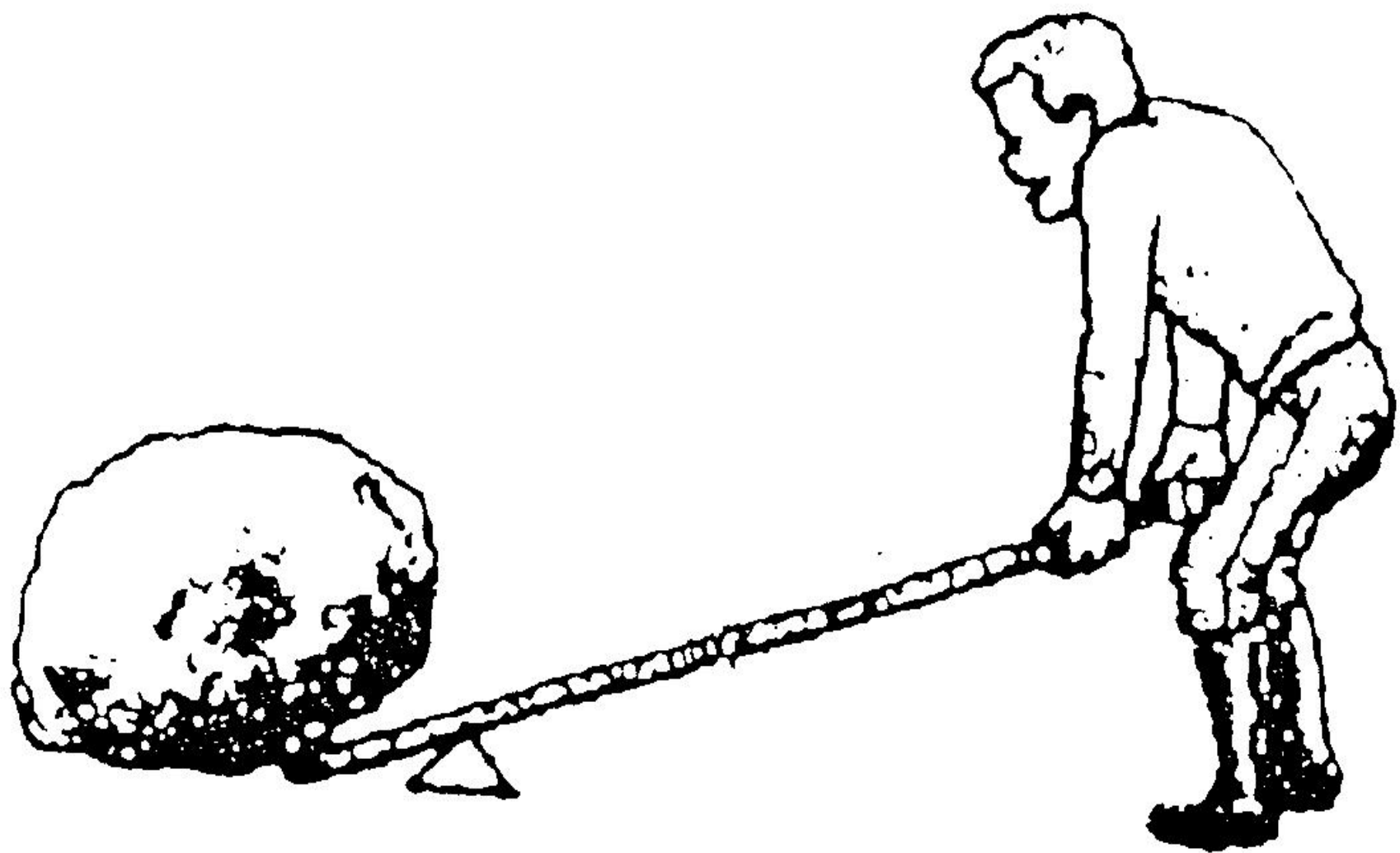


**Where are the spaces of the ones
